

Audio Recordings in Notability

The audio recording feature in Notability is a wonderful learning and teaching tool!

Younger students use recordings to learn to read and enunciate words, and older students use recordings to explore ideas and explain their thought processes. Teachers use it to provide instruction and personalized audio feedback.

Elementary School

- Students learn to read by reading a story out loud, then listen to themselves and highlight words they had a tough time reading.
- Teachers prepare assignments in Notability, these include audio instruction for educational scavenger hunts and take home work, and send it to their students.

Middle & High School

- In English, students record a brainstorm and write as they plan out an essay.
- In Math, students use the audio function to talk about how they are solving problems to make learning visible.
- In Foreign Language, students practice speaking and then listening to how they sound. Additionally, students are submitting audio notes to their teachers to review and provide feedback about pronunciation and style.
- Teachers provide audio feedback on assignments completed in Notability to provide a deeper connection with students and an enhanced learning experience.
