

Paperless Classrooms Using Notability

Paperless classrooms enable students to stay more organized and provide a single location for both students and teachers to access school-related material. Students import homework, class handouts, and additional learning material that is immediately organized and stored in Notability. Additionally, students will complete homework in Notability and send it back to the teacher electronically which reduces the material teachers have to carry around.

How to create a paperless classroom:

- Create a shared location between you and your students. This shared space can be a shared folder in Google Drive or Dropbox, or through an education management system such as Classroom, Canvas, or Schoology.
- Distribute class handouts, homework assignments, and additional learning materials in PDF format through the shared location.
- Students will import and organize the material as needed.
- Students will also complete homework assignments by annotating the imported files or by creating a new note depending on what the assignment calls for.
- Homework is then submitted to the teacher through the learning management system or to a folder only accessible to a single student and teacher.

Unique paperless classroom uses:

- Traditionally, students leave school binders with a teacher so the teacher is able to review a student's notes and organization. With a paperless classroom, students share a subject with a teacher via a shared folder in Google Drive or Dropbox. Teachers can look through this shared subject and leave comments and feedback.
- Teachers help students learn when they are absent by passing along class information, notes from a particular class, and by collecting assignments ensuring that they do not fall behind.
